Call for convenors for Modern Italian History Seminar at the

Institute of Historical Research, London

The convenors of the Modern Italian History Seminar at the Institute of Historical Research, London are looking to recruit two new convenors to join the team. As part of the convening team, you will be expected to take responsibility for organising at least one event per academic year (in person or hybrid, in London or elsewhere in the UK) and to play an active role in overseeing the seminar's management and selection of speakers. We generally organise 6 events per year which are a mixture of single-speaker talks and roundtables. Hybrid in-person events usually take place in London, though we are keen to host events in other locations in the UK. We also organise online-only events. Seminars generally take place on Wednesday evenings 17.30-19.00 GMT.

If you are interested in becoming a convenor, please submit:

- a short statement (max. 250 words) explaining why you would like to join the convening team, what you can contribute and any ideas for speakers and/or topics you think would be a good fit for the seminar;
- a short CV (max. 2 pages) to include your education, professional appointments, major publications and your experience of organising seminars, workshops etc.

Applications should be submitted to the seminar's Lead Convenor, Dr Selena Daly (University College London) at <u>selena.daly@ucl.ac.uk</u> by 5pm on July 3rd, 2024. Successful applicants will be informed by the start of August so that they can contribute to the seminar planning for 2024/25.

Please note:

- You must have your PhD in hand at the time of application but do not need to hold a permanent academic post. Applicants of any career stage, from early-career to professor, are welcomed.
- You can be based anywhere in the UK or abroad but please note that seminars take place in GMT (i.e. London) and that convenors are expected to attend seminars, in person or virtually.
- We are particularly keen to recruit convenors who are not based in London and to include perspectives and backgrounds not currently represented on the convening team.
- We are looking to recruit convenors whose research interests complement those already present on the convening team. Please see below for a list of current convenors and their research areas.

• You will most likely be an historian but we are also open to applicants working in adjacent fields (e.g. cultural studies, anthropology, sociology etc.) provided that your work focuses, broadly speaking, on the history of modern Italy.
