



Call for Papers

ASMI Postgraduate Summer School 2025

25 & 26 September

Domus Mazziniana, Pisa

The ASMI Postgraduate Summer School provides a forum for postgraduate students and early career scholars in the field of *Modern Italian History* and *Italian Studies* to share their research. We welcome proposals for papers from the 19th to the 21st century; panels might include, but are not limited to the following conference themes:

- Gender & Queer studies
- Media, communication, cultural consumption
- Identity, citizenship, belonging
- Patterns, discourses and procedures of political communication
- Colonialisms, migrations, mobility
- Anniversaries, public memories and the civic calendar
- Conflicts, resistances, mobilisations
- Mafias, criminality, the State
- Environment, energy policies, climate change and conflict

Participants will present their papers in panel sessions; papers can be in Italian or English and should be no more than 20 minutes in length. A discussant and a chair will be associated to each group session. The Summer School programme will also include two keynote lectures.

The Summer School is free to all members of ASMI. ASMI membership is offered at a discounted rate of £25 per calendar year to students and unwaged and includes the subscription to the journal *Modern Italy* (<https://asmi.org.uk/membership/>).

The Summer School will be hosted by the Domus Mazziniana. The Domus and ASMI will make available some travel bursaries of £100 to support the attendance of unwaged postgraduates and independent researchers. Anyone wishing to request the travel bursary must send a short explanatory note (max 300 words) justifying the need for support, attached with the proposal. The notes will be evaluated by the organising committee.

Please send an abstract (max 300 words) and a short bio (max 100 words) to the conference organisers at asmi.summerschool.2025@gmail.com by **Sunday June 15th, 2025**. Acceptances will be communicated by the end of the first week of July.

During the selection process, priority will be given to candidates who have not participated in previous editions of the Summer School.
